#### Selected Laws of Zimmun

- A women's zimmun can be said when three or more females above bat mitzva age eat together. Many authorities maintain that women's zimmun is optional (Shulchan Aruch OC 199:7) or commendable (Ben Ish Chai, Korach 13).
   Some view it as obligatory (Bei'ur HaGra OC 199:7).
- If three men are at a meal, women present are obligated in zimmun (SA OC 199:7). They can either participate in the men's zimmun or, if there are three or more women and fewer than ten men, form a separate women's zimmun (Mishna Berura 199:18, SA Ha-Rav 199:6).
- If one or two men are present, they may answer a women's zimmun (Halichot Beitah 12:7, in the name of Rav S. Z. Auerbach).
  - \* The masculine plural form can refer to all when men are present.
